Q. How do you begin your workday, and what are your responsibilities?

A. I start at about 6 a.m. and leave about 2:30 p.m. each work day. I am responsible for driving a truck that carries the home delivered meals to the distribution sites.

Q. Is there a philosophy or personal ideal that helps motivate you each day?

A. I am always trying to stay happy. When I come to work, I try to be happy and it carries through the day. I've been on this route of happiness for a long time.

Q. In reflecting upon your career, is there a time period that you found difficult?

A. It was a little difficult in the beginning. When I first got to America, I didn't speak English. I picked up English by working here and watching TV. Luckily, my manager at the time was Italian, so I was able to communicate with him and that made it a little easier for me.



Q. Is there a secret to your career's longevity?

A. I try to come in each day and make the best of difficult situations and help people along the way. As a driver, I have seen a lot of changes since 2000, especially with the owners – from Sodexo to Hearty Helpings. I have worked through all of the changes.

Q. What are your favorite aspects of working at Hearty Helpings?

A. I really like serving my community and getting out and talking to people. If I happen to not be here or if they don't see me for a day, people I see daily when I am delivering miss me. And, I miss them, too. The people I see and talk to, we all have fun working together. We work and we laugh, it's like a family.

FeedMore WNY celebrates launch of capital campaign's public phase

FeedMore WNY welcomed staff, board members, volunteers, and representatives from several of our partner agencies to our warehouse in September to kick off the start of the public phase of our capital campaign for a new campus.

Delaware North CEO Lou Jacobs is co-chairing the campaign with community volunteer Ann McCarthy, and Delaware North is donating \$1 million to demonstrate the Western New York business community's commitment to the project. In addition, Delaware North will match the first \$250,000 of public donations to the project, bringing the company's total contribution to \$1.25 million.

The new facility will centralize the organization's operations, which are at capacity due to the rapid increase of food insecurity among Western New York residents.

The new 197,700 square foot building will be constructed on a 74-acre site at 4832 Camp Road, Hamburg. The new campus will also provide space for Hearty Helpings operations.

Additionally, the new location is within the geographic center of the nonprofit's four-county operations. The campus will include our main warehouse, commissary, growing spaces, office and meeting space, as well as primary logistics on one parcel. FeedMore WNY is relying on a variety of public and private funding sources for the capital campaign. In addition to Delaware North, FeedMore has received seven-figure donations from Governor Kathy Hochul and the State of New York, the Federal Government, the estate of Anne Alford and Manson

Fiske Surdam, the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation and individual donors Dave and Joan Rogers.
